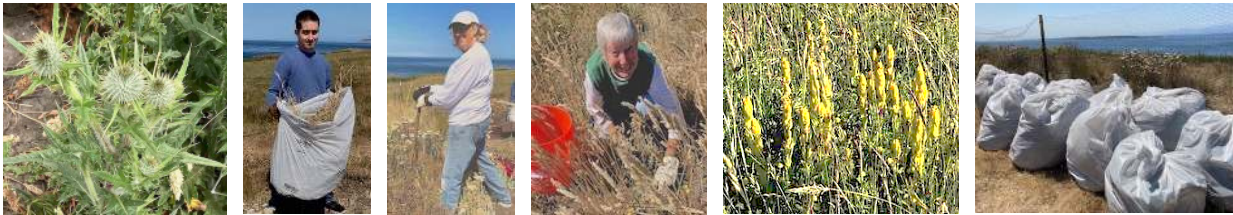




Friends of Whidbey State Parks Accomplishments July-December 2021!
